Dear Parents / Carers,

I trust you have had a wonderful summer holiday and I hope you enjoy the next week or so before we return to school. I am writing to remind you about our return to school dates, and to also share some information about our examination success this year.

## Return to school in September:

- Year 12 students who are starting their Post 16 studies with us will be coming in for an afternoon session on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2022. More information on this will be provided by the Post 16 team after places in the Sixth Form are confirmed.
- Year 12 students will also attend school on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> September at 8:30am. More information on this will also follow.
- Year 7 will begin on Monday 5th September 2022 at 8:30am.
- All other year groups (including Year 13) will begin on Tuesday 6th September 2022 at 8:30am as normal.

Now that the weather is returning to more normal temperatures, can I please remind you that all students should return in **full uniform**, including ties and blazers. All students should also wear shoes – **trainers of any kind are not allowed**. ## A Level, BTEC and GCSE Success

I am thrilled to be able to report that we have achieved another excellent set of results at both A Level and GCSE, and I want to pass on my congratulations to all students. I also thank you for your support at home, which is invaluable.

At A Level, we saw improvements since 2019 with an impressive set of results at the top end – a quarter of grades at A-A\* and half of all grades at A\*-B! This is a phenomenal achievement given the challenges of the last few years. We also saw great success at BTEC with a huge number of students achieving Distinction\* and/or Distinction. I am very proud of all our students, who as usual have headed off to a range of excellent universities including Oxford and Cambridge and the USA.

At GCSE, we have also improved our results since 2019, with 68% of students gaining Grades 9-5 (a strong pass) in both English and Maths and 83% gaining Grades 9-4 (a good pass). Our progress 8 measure is +0.86 including the Teacher Assessed Grades that our students gained in Year 10, which means that on average, students achieved almost a whole grade higher in their subjects compared to their expected

progress based on prior attainment. We also achieved a stunning set of results at the top end, with almost a quarter of our entries being graded 9-8. 37% of our grades were awarded grades 9-7 (equivalent to A\*/A), an achievement we are immensely proud of. Both of these measures are 6% higher than the 2019 set of results.

I look forward to seeing your sons and daughters when we return in September, for what I hope will be another successful year, but one that is hopefully less disruptive than the last few have been.

We will be running several events early in the term where I hope that I will see as many of you as possible. More details of these will be provided in September.
