

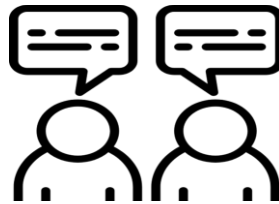
## Year 10 'Face to Face Time' from 15<sup>th</sup> June 2020

Government has announced that they wish for Year 10 to have some 'face to face time' from 15<sup>th</sup> June 2020.

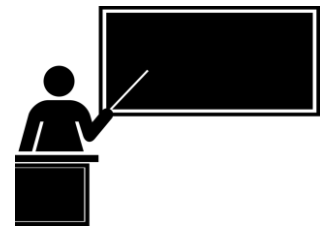
### What is the purpose of 'face to face time'?



To support students' mental wellbeing.



To re-connect socially, at a distance!



To get support from teachers with remote learning and have some teaching in core subjects.

### What is 'face to face time'?

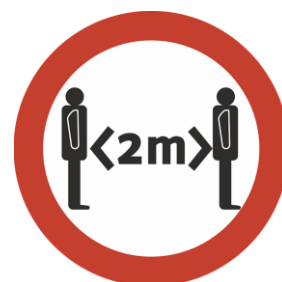
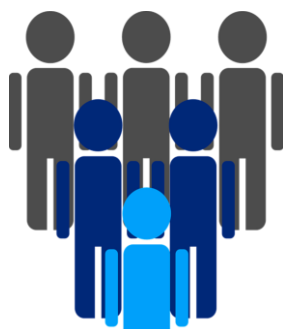
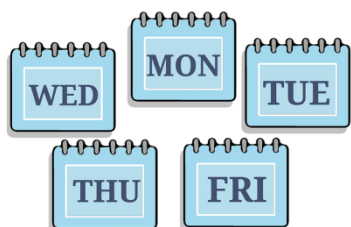
'Face to face time' is a very limited and partial return to school for Year 10 students (and possibly Year 12 at a later date). It is an opportunity for students to come into school for a few hours before the end of this term, to re-familiarise themselves with the school environment and to meet their teachers for some short sessions.

'Face to face time' is **not a full return to school**. Students will only be coming in for a few hours between now and the end of term.

### What will students be doing in 'face to face time'?

Students will have 1 hour sessions in English, Maths and Science (3 hours of teaching time in total). Teachers may check the understanding of remote learning that has already taken place, teach some new concepts, revise previous learning and/or set up the remote learning that is to come.

## What will 'face to face time' look like at GHS?



Students will come to school for **one morning per week only**. Students will be told which day they are coming in soon.

Students will **remain in the same small groups** ('bubble') all morning. Each group will have max 8-10 students in it. They will not mix with students in other groups.

**Strict social distancing will take place** at all times. There will be sanctions for students who do not follow social distancing rules.

## What time and day will my child come in and what group will he/she be in?

Students will be told to arrive at either 8:30am or 9am, depending on the group he or she is in. Students will be told come to school for just one morning per week. Sessions will finish at either 12:30pm or 1pm, depending on which group he or she is in. Details of groupings, days and times will be communicated separately to students over the next few days. We will try to match students to their teachers but this cannot be guaranteed.

## Will my child get lunch?

Lunch will not be provided, Children who are entitled to a free school meal should use the voucher they are receiving.

## What will my child do on the days he/she is not in school?

When your child is not in school, he/she will continue to work through the remote learning being set by his or her teachers. If you have problems accessing the online learning, please let us know so we can help you.

## **Is it compulsory to send my child to school?**

Government have made it clear that it is parents' choice whether or not to send their child to school for 'face to face time.' If you decide to keep your child at home, you will not be issued fines for non-attendance.

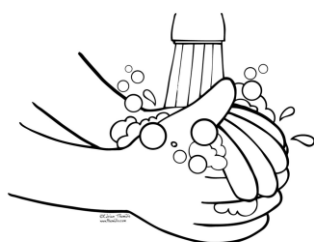
## **What if my child is ill?**

If your child is ill with Covid-19 symptoms, or if anyone in your household is displaying Covid-19 symptoms, your child must not attend school and must self isolate and follow government guidance. You **must** let us know if you child has Covid-19 symptoms so that we can follow the Government 'track and trace procedures.'

## **Can I send my other children to school?**

Only Year 10 students are eligible to attend school at the moment. Year 12 may return in a few weeks time, but this is not guaranteed and we will communicate further details about this at a later date. If you are a keyworker or if your child has a EHCP and /or social worker, then you can send your child into school, but you must email us at [keystudents@greenford.ealing.sch.uk](mailto:keystudents@greenford.ealing.sch.uk) to let us know.

## **How will the school be kept clean and hygienic?**



Regular, thorough handwashing will take place with new handwashing stations on site.



There will be thorough cleaning taking place each day, both throughout the day and after students leave.



Doors and windows will be left open for ventilation.

## What happens if there is a case of Covid-19 in the school?

If a child, or member of staff tests positive for Covid-19, then everybody who has been in contact with that child or teacher (in the small teaching group or 'bubble') will have to self-isolate for 14 days.

## What else do I need to know?

There is no requirement for students to wear masks. If students choose to wear a mask / gloves on their way to school, these must be removed on entry to the school and replaced with clean ones. School cannot provide masks / gloves.

Students should walk to school where possible and avoid public transport.

Students must wear uniform of trousers / skirt, shirt and tie. **Blazers do not need to be worn.** Students should bring a pen, pencil, water bottle and snack.
